

CJCU Student Academic Ethics Code

05-31-2012 Review and approved by the 2011 Second Semester End Academic Affairs Meeting

- Article 1: Chang Jung Christian University has established the Chang Jung Christian University Student Academic Ethics Code (hereafter "the Code") in order to establish correct academic values and code of conduct, and guide students to comply with academic ethics.
- Article 2: Students shall observe the Chang Jung Christian University Academic Regulations; Graduate Student Degree Examination Regulation, Graduate Student and Thesis Guidance Professor Interaction Guidelines; Doctoral & Master's Degree Thesis Plagiarism, Ghostwriting, or Fraud Handling Guidelines; and other relevant provisions.
- Article 3: Students should uphold their enthusiasm for learning in order to enrich their knowledge.
1. Observe class times.
 2. Turn in homework, reports, theses, and literary works and participate in tests on time.
 3. Actively participate in the teaching and research activities.
 4. Adhere to the professional advice of teachers on academic guidance.
- Article 4: Students should uphold a rigorous attitude in seeking knowledge.
1. Carefully deal with research data and results, without fabricating or tampering with the research results or citing other people's information improperly.
 2. Properly record and save relevant information, and appropriately provide the information for inspection, examination, or publication.
 3. Consider and analyze research results carefully, including findings that conflict with pre-research expectations.
 4. Take responsibility for the homework, reports, theses, or literary works submitted.

Article 5: Students shall adhere to the principle of good faith during publications.

1. Academic assignments, reports, dissertations, and writings must be completed in person without any fraudulent practices such as plagiarism, copying, using a ghostwriter, ghostwriting for others, or illegally downloading other people's information from the Internet.
2. Respect the intellectual property rights of others, and do not photocopy textbooks illegally or arbitrarily copy or distribute non-legally authorized software to others. Sources shall be cited when citing other people's work or information.
3. Obtain consent from the actual research participants and contributors and list them as authors during research result publication. Research results shall not be repeatedly published in academic journals. When two or more people have collaborated in research, do not claim the research results as your own.
4. Abide by the relevant copyright law provisions.

Article 6: This Code is approved by the Academic Affairs Meeting, promulgated for execution after approval by the president, and the same shall apply to its amendments.
