

CJCU Regulations for Implementation of the Course Module System in the Day Division

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Article 1. In response to talent demand trends, Chang Jung Christian University (CJCU) has integrated its teaching resources to create concise student oriented professional courses and a top-quality, diverse, flexible, and cross-disciplinary learning environment. Chang Jung Christian University has thus established the Chang Jung Christian University Regulations for Implementation of the Course Module System in the Day Division (hereinafter the "Regulations") is hereby established to encourage all departments to accelerate the course modularization process.

Article 2. The course modularization structure of CJCU is as follows:

1. Liberal arts education credits.
2. The college/department core required basic courses are designated as 42-48 credits for the "Basic Module" of the academic department.
3. Each general professional elective module of a department offers 12-24 credits. (Plus 1-3 credits for ethics courses)
 - (1) Each academic department shall design professional elective module courses based on the development goals and the core competencies of the students, and shall set required credits required for each module. The module designs shall incorporate career paths and professional occupations, take the career development directions such as employment or further studies into consideration, and guide the students to set study goals and motives in order to strengthen the competitiveness of graduates.
 - (2) Professional elective courses shall be divided into 2-5 "professional elective modules" based on professional and competency requirements. Since 2020 academic year, professional elective courses shall be divided into 2-3 "professional elective modules" which shall have the titles of "○○○ (Academic) Module," "○○○ (Integrated) Module," or "○○○ (Practical) Module."
4. To encourage study diversification and cultivate cross-disciplinary competency of the students, colleges shall integrate internal and external teaching resources and establish at least one "Cross-disciplinary Program" entitled "○○○Cross-disciplinary Program," which shall be jointly designed and instructed by intra-departmental or cross-disciplinary faculty. Relevant matters shall be undertaken

according to the CJCUC Regulations for Establishment of Cross-Disciplinary Programs.

5. Electives

Electives include courses offered by CJCUC colleges and departments (including the original department and college of a student), liberal arts courses, or any courses offered by other departments.

Article 3. If similar or equivalent courses from different modules are recognized by the review committee of the respective modules, the courses can be jointly recognized in order to satisfy the requirement of different modules. The credits of the jointly recognized courses in each module shall not exceed 1/2 of the credits for said module, and the total graduation credits of the jointly recognized courses shall only be counted once, except for credits jointly recognized by a cross-disciplinary program.

Article 4. The total course credits of each elective module shall not exceed 2 times of the module's required credits.

Article 5. Student graduation requirements are as follows:

1. Complete the liberal arts credits, one basic module and 1 or 2 professional elective modules or one cross-disciplinary program offered by the college or department to which students enroll (determined by the department). Total graduation credits must reach 128 or more, and insufficient credits may be supplemented via free elective course credits.

Starting from the 2021 academic year, the maximum elective credits from other departments that can be counted is 15. However, students who have completed the "Professional Electives: 000 Cross-disciplinary Program" or the "Cross-disciplinary Minor: 000 Cross-disciplinary Program" as well as microcredit courses in their respective college, are exempt from this restriction.

2. On or prior to the 2018 academic year, the credit limit for each module from the Accreditation of Chinese Collegiate School of Business (ACCSB) academic departments (Bachelor's Degree Programs) and from the Bachelor Degree Program of International MICE Management is 34 credits. Students who have completed the liberal arts education credits, the basic module and one professional elective module offered by the college or department to which students enroll in order to graduate shall have total credits of 128 or more. From the 2019 to the 2011 academic year, each unit of the College of Management plans 2 professional elective modules, with each module consisting of 15-24 credits. Students are required to fulfill the liberal arts education credits, the basic module offered by the belonging college or department and at least one professional elective module offered by the belonging department. The total number of credits required for graduation must be 128 or more. In case of insufficient credits, students can make up for the deficit by taking free elective courses.

Starting from the 2022 academic year, each unit of the College of Management plans 2-3 professional elective modules, with each module consisting of 12-24 credits. Students are required to fulfill the liberal arts education credits, the basic module offered by the belonging college or department and at least one

professional elective module offered by the belonging department. The total number of credits required for graduation must be 128 or more. In case of insufficient credits, students can make up for the deficit by taking free elective courses.

Starting from the 2021 academic year, the maximum elective credits from other departments that can be counted is 15. Those who have completed "Professional Electives: ○○○ Cross-disciplinary Program " or " Cross-disciplinary Minor: ○○○ Cross-disciplinary Program " and microcredit courses in each college are not subject to this restriction.

3. The implementation regulations of the core required basic courses and the professional elective module of the Department of Nursing shall be formulated with reference to the eligibility and regulations of the Professional and Technical Senior Examination for Registered Professional Nurses.
4. Students of the Bachelor's Degree Program in Southeast Asian Culture and Industry emphasizing interdisciplinary independent learning must complete courses up to a total of 128 credits, including liberal arts education, program basic modules, and electives.
5. Conform to the graduation threshold set by CJCUC colleges and departments. All academic departments and Bachelor's degree programs shall establish stricter graduation conditions according to the professional needs as compared to those specified above, and shall clearly establish and announce the course curriculum. Starting from the 2023 academic year, it is no longer mandatory to complete the professional elective modules as a graduation requirement.

Article 6. In addition to the proof of original degree, the degree certificates shall also specify the following based on the modules completed or course credits earned:

1. Conform to any of the following requirements, the degree certificate shall specify "Double Major: ○○○ Department has Awarded the ○○○ Degree".
 - (1) Students shall complete 25 credits from the basic module of double major, and any one of the professional elective modules. At least 20 credits of the Basic Module shall not be the same as the major department courses, Insufficient credits from the Basic Module of the additional department can be supplemented by taking subjects from the additional department.
 - (2) Students shall complete 25 credits from the basic module of the double major and 15 credits of professional electives. The mandatory additional department credits should not overlap with the courses offered by the major department. Insufficient credits from the Basic Module can be supplemented by taking subjects from the additional department.
2. The degree certificate shall specify "Minor: ○○○ Department" for those who have completed at least 20 credits from the basic modules of additional department.

The mandatory additional department credits should not overlap with the courses offered by the major department. If there is a shortfall in credits from the basic module of the additional department, it can be supplemented by

taking subjects from the additional department.

3. The degree certificate shall specify "Professional Electives: 000 Module, 000 Module, or 000 Cross-disciplinary Program" for those who have completed the professional elective modules or cross-disciplinary program set by this department.
4. The degree certificate shall specify "Cross-disciplinary Minor: 000 Module, 000 Module, or 000 Cross-disciplinary Program" for those who have completed the professional elective modules or cross-disciplinary program set by other departments.

Article 7. During the transition period in which the modular course system coexists with the old system, the old system shall apply to the handling matters relating to the certification of graduation eligibility, double major, minor, or credit programs. Departments shall first set course credit recognition and waive principles for students who cannot make up the credits due to changes in course matching.

After the implementation of the course module system, based on the actual status of completed course credits, students pursuing a dual-joint degree may apply for graduation qualification in accordance with the minimum requirement of 128 credits of CJCJ required courses, college required courses, and electives during registration and course selection in the second semester of the senior year.

Article 8. After planning or revising the college basic modules, cross-disciplinary programs, and department modules, a college/department shall submit such modules and programs to the college/department curriculum committee for approval before forwarding to the university curriculum committee for review.

Article 9. The Regulations shall be implemented after the passage of the Administrative Affairs Meeting and approval of the president, and the same shall apply to the amendments thereof.
