Article 1: This regulation is established pursuant to the University Act and Article 24 and 25 of its enforcement rules, and Paragraph 1, Article 4 of the Degree Conferral Law.

Article 2: Bachelor's students of different departments of CJCU may apply to study in a different department as double major starting from the second academic year until the first semester of the graduation academic year.

Article 3: Students applying for a double major shall first obtain consent from the directors of the first major department and the second major department, and then submit the application to the head of Academic Affairs for approval.

Article 4: Students pursuing a double major must select the most advantageous course matching table for auditing based on their preferred courses in order to protect the students' rights. Students who are pursuing a double major in nursing are not allowed to change their course matching table after

submitting the application. In addition to completing the mandatory courses and credits of the major department, mandatory additional department credit rules for double major students are as follows:

(1) Students are required to complete 25 credits from the basic module of the double major, as well as choose one professional elective module. At least 20 credits from the basic module should not overlap with the courses offered by the major department. In cases where there is a shortage of credits from the basic module, students can make up for it by taking subjects from the additional department.

(2) Students are required to complete 25 credits from the basic module of the double major and 15 credits of professional electives. The mandatory additional department credits should not overlap with the courses offered by the major department. In cases where there is a shortage of credits from the basic module, students can make up for it by taking subjects from the additional department.

If students meet either the preceding criteria, 1 or 2, the degree certificate shall specify "Double Major: ○○○ Department has Awarded the ○○○ Degree".

Article 5: If the additional department courses have study order restrictions, such restrictions shall apply. The additional department and major department credits shall be subject to the upper and lower semester restrictions. Credit overload regulations shall be handled according to the University regulations.

Article 6: The courses, credits, and grades of the other department and the major department for double major students shall be jointly calculated. If the total number of semesters, qualified score accumulation, grade point average, or disqualified credits have met the dropout requirements; Should include credits

from other departments as well.

Article 7: Double major students who have completed the mandatory courses and credits for the major department within the study duration deadline or within the two-year extension period after said deadline but have failed to complete the mandatory courses and credits for the second major department may extend the study duration deadline for one more year or abandon the double major and graduate from the major department. However, students who have completed the mandatory courses and credits for the second major department within the study duration deadline or within the two-year extension period after said deadline but have failed to complete the mandatory courses and credits for the major department shall be dropped-out and the graduation qualification for the other department shall not be recognized.

Article 8: Transfer students who studied a double major in their previous schools shall submit an application to retain the original major department as the double major in the enrollment academic year according to Articles 2 and 3 of this Regulation.

Article 9: Chinese or English degree certificates, report cards, and degree certificates for students who have completed and passed the courses and credits required by the double major department must specify the name of the double major. If a student has not yet completed all of the professional (specialized) mandatory courses and credits for the second major department but has met the standard for the minor department, the title of the minor department shall be specified.

Article 10: In case students must extend their duration of study due to taking a double major, a miscellaneous fee of NT\$4500 will be charged, no matter how many credits taken.

If a student cannot complete the mandatory courses and credits of the double major due to a temporary suspension of studies or withdrawal, the refund standard shall be handled according to the "College Student Leave and Suspension Refund Operation Guideline," and no refund shall be requested due to non-leave or suspension reasons.

Article 11: This Regulation shall be announced after approval by the University Affairs Meeting and submitted to the Ministry of Education for future reference, and the same shall apply to its amendments.
