

# Chang Jung Christian University

## Regulations for Undertaking Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees

Reviewed and passed at the End-of-Semester Academic Affairs Meeting,  
First Semester, Academic Year 2025–2026, December 16, 2025  
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- Article 1 In order to assist students in developing in accordance with their aptitudes; to cultivate multidisciplinary talents equipped with creativity; and in accordance with Paragraph 3, Article 3 of the Chang Jung Christian University Rules for Establishing Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees (below, the "Rules"), the University formulates these Chang Jung Christian University Regulations for Establishing Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees (below, the "Regulations").
- Article 2 At the latest, a daytime undergraduate student at the University shall apply for a bachelor's degree under these Rules before the beginning of the first semester of their last year of study (not including an extended period in which they must complete their degree program). Such a student shall apply by the application deadline specified in the school calendar; one student may be approved for a maximum of one interdisciplinary bachelor's degree.
- Article 3 The number of persons approved to undertake interdisciplinary bachelor's degrees is regulated by the Rules.
- Article 4 A student who applies to undertake an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree (below, an "applying student") shall first complete the courses described in Article 3 of the Chang Jung Christian University Rules for Establishing Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees; having done so, the applying student shall submit an application plan to the Office of Academic Affairs Teaching and Learning Promotion Center (below, the "TALPC"). The matters to be included in the application plan, its format, and detailed content shall be separately specified by the Office of Academic Affairs Registration and Curriculum Section (below, the "RACS").
- Once the TALPC receives the application, they will submit it to PLUS Campus; PLUS Campus will then submit it to the review group for review. The review results will be notified to the applying student and their department, and co-notification will be

given to the RACS.

Rules for the establishment and operating methods of the review group in the previous Paragraph shall be separately formulated.

Article 5

If a course module, multidisciplinary credit course, or PLUS Campus micro-course that a student takes has a name identical with that of a required course module, multidisciplinary credit course, or PLUS Campus micro-course for the student's department, the credit shall not be calculated more than once. If the total number of credits for the three complete course modules is less than the stipulated number of required credits, the student must then take additional course modules, multidisciplinary credit courses, or PLUS Campus micro-courses to make up the difference, and shall submit a written report via PLUS Campus for record-keeping.

Article 6

If, during their pursuit of an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, a student requires modification to any of the following matters, they shall submit an application to the TALPC; the modification may only be made once the application is passed by the review group:

1. Internship, practicum, or specialized courses.
2. Course modules, multidisciplinary credit courses, or PLUS Campus micro-courses.
3. Name of bachelor's degree.

Article 7

If a student undertaking an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree has already complied with the graduation requirements for their department, but has not yet complied with the graduation requirements for the interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, the student may apply to the RACS to abandon pursuing said degree, and instead graduate in accordance with the graduation requirements for their department.

If a student undertaking an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree has already complied with the graduation requirements for the interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, but has not yet complied with the graduation requirements for their department, the student may apply to the RACS to abandon studying in their department, and instead graduate in accordance with the graduation requirements for the interdisciplinary bachelor's degree.

When a student applies to abandon their eligibility to pursue an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree in accordance with Paragraph 1,

they must submit said application on or before December 25 for the first semester, or on or before May 25 for the second semester. However, in the following circumstances, these restrictions do not apply:

1. If a bachelor's degree student admitted via a master's degree program is waitlisted, then the application must be submitted within five working days of the day after they receive notice of substitute acceptance from the waitlist.
2. If a student receiving a non-passing grade in a registered course results in the student being unable to receive graduation eligibility for the interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, then the application must be submitted within five working days of the day after said non-passing grade is posted on the internet.
3. Where other, unique circumstances apply, and the student has provided certification to and received permission from PLUS Campus.

After a student has been approved to abandon an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, the student shall not request restoration of already-abandoned study eligibility.

#### Article 8

A student shall not use abandonment of pursuing an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree as cause for requesting supplementary add/drops or withdrawals after the add/drop/withdrawal deadline has passed.

After a student abandons their eligibility to pursue an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, then the student's department shall determine questions of whether the student's already-taken, passing credits in interdisciplinary bachelor's degree courses are to be calculated as part of the student's elective credits.

#### Article 9

When a student pursuing an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree has an extended period in which they must complete their degree program, then once the two years of the extended period have elapsed, and the student has completed the required courses and credits within their department but has not completed the required courses and credits for their interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, then the student may again extend the period in which they must complete their degree program by one semester or one academic year. If, after this period, they are still unable to complete the required courses and credits for their interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, then the student

may, upon review, graduate in accordance with their departmental eligibility.

Article 10 A student's yearly transcripts and related certifying documents for an interdisciplinary bachelor's degree shall all display the name of the interdisciplinary bachelor's degree. However, where the student has abandoned eligibility or withdrawn from studies, this shall not be displayed.

Article 11 On April 11 of each year, the University shall review students' interdisciplinary bachelor's degree graduation eligibility. Once reviewed and approved by PLUS Campus and the RACS, the application is submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs for issuance of the degree diploma.

Article 12 Once passed by the Academic Affairs Meeting, these Rules shall take effect from their day of promulgation.
