

## **Guideline for In-bound Exchange Students**

## 1. Korean language proficiency:

- 1) Applicants for the 2026 In-bound Exchange Student Program must meet the following conditions: passing the Test of Proficiency in Korean (TOPIK) level 2, completing the Social Integration Program level 2 or higher, obtaining a pre-assessment score of 41 point or higher, and completing Korean Beginner 2 course of the King Sejong Institute.
- 2) If the specified Korean language proficiency is not met, the selection process for in-bound exchange students may be affected.

#### 2. Tuition:

- 1) The tuition for the degree program of the in-bound exchange student is waived under the mutual exchange agreement.
- 2) Those who need to participate in the Korean Language Institute class among in-bound exchange students shall be charged with a 50% reduction in tuition fees for the Korean Language Institute. (50% discounted Korean language course tuition is KRW 625,000 including admission fee).
- 3) In addition, cultural experience fee is KRW 50,000

## 3. Curriculums:

- 1) Exchange students can study in Korean language course & degree curriculum depending on their Korean language ability.
- 2) Most degree courses are taught in Korean & some conversational subjects taught in Chinese & English.
- 3) Exchange students with Korean ability less than TOPIK 3 must study the Korean language course(www.hskli.com)
- 4) The enrollment for curriculum for exchange students usually starts one week before the opening of each semester.

- 5) However, the application for course enrollment can be closed on the first served basis.
- 6) Hansei University can decline the students' course registration requests based on its curriculum regulations.
- 7) Korean language course Class time: 09: 00  $\sim$  13: 00 (Mon to Fri). Total of 200 hours in 10 weeks (For 1 quarter).
- 8) Korean language course is offered by Hansei University; 5 courses in total. (Speaking, Listening, Reading, Writing)
- 9) Course credit recognition is the responsibility of the students' home university.

## 4. Dormitory

- 1) Dormitory fee: KRW 700,000 / 1 semester (4 persons per room) KRW 750,000 / 1 semester (3 persons per room)
- 2) In-school & dormitory area, free wireless internet service is available.
- 3) Single Bed & desk furnishings are provided in the dorm room (However, bed covers, pillow & blankets are not provided)
- 4) The Dormitory fee does not include the cost of meals.
- 5) Inbound exchange students can move into the school dormitory from the date announced by the dormitory administration office during the weekly period just before the start of the semester.
- 6) Curfew(Dorm closes at every 12:00 AM/Curfew can be changed at the dormitory administration office every semester)

## 5. Pick up Service (Airport to Hansei Univ.)

- 1) Pick-up service is available free of charge only for the first time in certain condition.
- 2) Condition: Students arriving at Incheon International Airport from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on the scheduled date. (The scheduled pick-up service date will

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#### be notified separately)

#### 6. Additional cost

- 1) Cost of insurance for the In-bound exchange student's stay in Korea (not required if the student has insurance in their home country)
- Foreigners Insurance: KRW 42,000/6 months
- 2) Application for Alien Registration Card: KRW 30,000
- 3) Korean cultural experience fee: KRW 50,000
- 4) The cost of meals and class materials fluctuates depending on each student's situation.

#### **7. VISA**

- 1) During the screening process for applicants to the In-bound Student Program, successful applicants will receive a Certificate of Admissions. Those who have received a Certificate of Admissions should use it to visit a local Korean immigration agency to arrange for VISA approval and entry into Korea.
- 2) The status of VISA type for in-bound exchange students will be D-2-6.
- 3) In Korea, D-2-6 status holders are covered by the National Health Insurance and may be billed for related health insurance premiums.

- 5. Scanned of Bank Statement Over KRW 20,000,000 or USD 15,500.00/ 1 semester ~2 semesters

- 7. Family Certificate (Only when the bank account holder is one of students' parents.)
- 8. Recommendation Letter by Home University (free format)
- 9. Proof of Enrollment of Home University (1 semester or more)
- ① For studnts from countries except China: Submission of certificate of enrollment after confirmation of apostille or consular confirmation

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<sup>(5)</sup> and (6) show completion of Step 5 or higher (unchecked is acceptable), but passing the assessment.





- ② For students from China, submit an accreditation report for bachelor's enrollment issued by the Educational Background & Degree Certification Center operated by the Chinese Ministry of Education. CHSI (From August 15, 2022, degree certification at domestic universities in China is only available through the Xuexin Network)
- 10. Copy of educational institution business registration certificate (or identification number)
