

# **Chang Jung Christian University Grants and Application Regulations for New Overseas Students.**

Approved on July 25, 2019 by the 2nd Scholarship, Grant and Work Study Review Committee of Academic Year 2018 Semester 2.

Approved on May 12, 2020 by the 2nd Scholarship, Grant and Work Study Review Committee of Academic Year 2019 Semester 2.

Approved on March 3, 2021 by the 1st Scholarship, Grant and Work Study Review Committee of Academic Year 2020 Semester 2.

Approved on March 28, 2024 by the 1st Scholarship, Grant and Work Study Review Committee of Academic Year 2023 Semester 2.

Article I. The Regulations are formulated to encourage outstanding overseas students to apply for admission and complete their studies at the University, and assist overseas students with settling into their new life in Taiwan, thereby promoting the internationalization of the University.

Article II. The “overseas students” referred to in the Regulations are foreign students and overseas Chinese students (including Hong Kong and Macao students, but excluding Mainland students) who meet the requirements of the Ministry of Education's regulations for overseas student status.

Article III. Eligibility for new students are as follow:

1. Meet the University's qualifications for overseas students, and admitted through the University's admission channels, transfer student is not included.
2. The PH.D Program is according to “Chang Jung Christian University Establishing International Doctoral Student Scholarships and Application Regulations”.
3. The student from the program or department teaching in English which started after 2020 is not included.
4. Any foreign student who is a recipient of the Taiwan Scholarship from either the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) or the Ministry of Education (MOE), or who has been granted any other scholarship from within this institution, is not eligible for this particular scholarship concurrently.

Article IV. Grant amount and review shall be based on the following principles:

1. Admission grants in the first semester shall be NT \$35,000.
2. Grant applications shall be submitted to the Office of Global Engagement. The Office of Global Engagement shall convene a review committee to review student documents required by this Regulations, and approve grants accordingly.
3. Grants shall be approved on a per semester basis, and application shall be submitted for review in each subsequent semester.

Article V. Application Method and Deadline:

1. Overseas students applying for admissions discounts shall submit acceptance notification and application form (as attached) to the Office of Global Engagement upon notification of acceptance. Following approval, applicants may begin their payment process. Those unable to complete payment on time for any reason must complete payment within one month after school begins. Payments shall be refunded following approval.
2. Download application form from the Office of Global Engagement website.

Article VI. Submit the following documents for grant application:

1. Grant Application Form.
2. Two letters of recommendation (in Chinese or English).
3. Study plan (in Chinese or English).
4. Autobiography (in Chinese or English; 300 ~ 500 words).
5. For foreign students, submit proof of Chinese or English language proficiency.
6. Transcripts of highest educational level at the time of admission.
7. Other supporting documents (attach proof of low income for reference, if any).

Article VII. The grant quota for each academic year shall be adjusted according to the University budget.

Article VIII. Grant students found to have forged or provided false information shall have their grant qualification revoked and dealt with in accordance with relevant laws and regulations.

Article IX. The Regulations are implemented upon approval by the Scholarship, Grant and Work Study Review Committee, and subsequent approval by the University President; the same shall apply to amendments.
