

# Student Competitiveness Improvement Guidelines for the College of Management, Chang Jung Christian University

Approved at the final College of Management Meeting held in the spring semester of the 2011 academic year on May 23, 2012

Article 1 The Student Competitiveness Improvement Guidelines (hereinafter referred to as “the Guidelines”) are established to improve the competitiveness of students in the College of Management on professional and international levels.

Article 2 The Guidelines are intended to guide students to participate in national (or international) major competitions and to obtain professional certificates for enhancing their professional knowledge and skills, improving their competitiveness in their career and graduates’ professional and practical management skills, as well as encouraging students to apply for an international student exchange program to broaden their global vision and strengthen their international competitiveness.

Article 3 Each division under the College of Management shall specify a number of suitable national or international competitions in accordance with its specialties, and select full-time faculty to coach and train student teams for these competitions.

Article 4 Subsidies

1. National (or international) major competitions

(1) Eligibility

A team shall participate in a national (or international) intercollegiate competition organized by the public or private sector on behalf of a division under the College of Management. (Sports competition, exhibition match, invitational game, and observation and learning-oriented competition are excluded.)

(2) Subsidy

1. COM will cover expenses for transportation, meals, accommodation, document copying, application and insurance to full-time teachers during training.

2. COM will cover expenses for transportation, meals, accommodation, document copy, application and insurance to participating teams. One team from each division can receive up to NT\$10,000 each academic year.

3. Subsidy application shall be submitted after a competition in accordance with regulations set by the Accounting Office. If a participating team uses false information to apply for a subsidy or does not comply with relevant regulations, the team shall return the subsidy and the division to which the team is affiliated will not be allowed to apply for a subsidy for 1 year.

2. Subsidy for a Professional Certificate

(1) Eligibility

A division from the College shall consider its specialties to recommend national or international certificate exams organized by the public or private sectors, and a student may take and pass one of the recommended exams as a COM student

(2) Subsidy

1. A full-time faculty member may choose the resources required during training to apply for a subsidy.
2. If a student passes a certificate exam, the cost will be subsidized in full. The maximum subsidy for each application is NT\$2,500.
3. For the same certificate examination, each student is subsidized only once. If a division or an individual receives a certificate subsidy more than once, the full subsidy shall be returned.

3. Subsidy for Exchange Students:

To encourage students to study abroad, any student who participates in an exchange program as a COM student may apply for a subsidy. The amount of the subsidy will be determined after the annual education subsidy allocation is completed. This type of application may not be filed to another division.

4. Subsidies listed above (except for EMBA) that are provided from the annual education subsidy may be reallocated. The amount is allocated equally among divisions under the College of Management. Each division may utilize a subsidy from another division with an agreement.

Article 5 The Guidelines become effective after being approved in the College of Management Meeting and ratified by the President. Amendments must follow the same procedure.
